This is going to be a regular desire of mine in the coming year, that we work with others to come to a better understanding of ourselves and to enjoy the critical mass of energy, knowledge, experience and wisdom when we work with others. I think this has been one of the things we have missed with the changing of the larger church governance. We no longer have Presbytery which was that body where much of the cooperative work was shared. In the new structure congregations have been left to their own devices and we have largely played in our own sandboxes or silos. It is time to change that narrow and, in my opinion, dangerous focus. So whether you are traveling or staying at home; go to worship, online or in person, at a familiar building or new one and observe. Observe how you are welcomed. Observe the feelings of the congregation. Observe what is the focus of worship (atonement or grace). Observe and when you come home to Forest Hill observe if you see and feel differently here. Remember travel is a spiritual experience.



Amen to That!!





Oh, God, forgive me when I whine; I have two ears—the world is mine.





Do you love to cook? Our hope is that folks will put together a "team" to prepare a meal at least once a month to provide food and fellowship at Forest Hill United Church.






